The next day was the uptown section of Annapolis, including a walk through the Harley-Davidson motorcycle showroom, one of the largest in the Northeast. Nice bikes! Finally, the third day's walk consisted of a beautiful wooded walk through Savage Park in nearby Howard County. The trail followed the Little Patuxent

River. Joan Kimmel and her son and daughter also attended this walk as well.

Besides the walks themselves, the convention offered seminars on a "Menu for Club Success" for club members as well as a librarian from the US Naval Academy (USNA) who gave a very interesting history talk on the Academy. The USNA was not on these walks, but is a part of the normal Annapolis YRE.

Of course, a Saturday night banquet was also held at the hotel which provided a chance to meet other walkers from Maryland and Virginia that sat at our table.

WALKING THE EASTER WEEKEND IN MARYLAND BY BETTY GREEN

ike and I participated in 4 Volkssport walks in Maryland during an extended Easter weekend. The weather was perfect and many trees in bloom. Among trees in bloom that we could identify were plum, cherry, pear, and redbud. Daffodils and hyacinths were up and

plenty of pansies were already planted. What a gorgeous weekend!

Our first walk (Friday) was the Annapolis Amblers' 11K, Historic Annapolis (YR 264). This beautiful walk takes you through the Annapolis historic area (including the MD State House, the oldest state Capitol in continuous legislative use and many historic buildings) the Annapolis Harbor and City Dock, through the campus of the US Naval Academy, and historic Eastport. Fabulous!

Our second walk (Saturday) was the Columbia Volksmarch Club's 10K, Village of Harper's Choice (YR 0370). This was nostalgic for us, as we had lived in Columbia, MD as newlyweds back in 1972! This walk is a combination of village sidewalks and paved pathways through Columbia open space. The Walk Box is at a great store in Village of Hickory Ridge called Feet First. Upon Andrew Schmidt's recommendation, we tried some double-layer blister prevention "Wright Socks" purchased at Feet First and were very impressed. You drive a short distance from Feet First to the start of the trail. The walk can actually be combined with the Village of Hickory Ridge walk for a 20 km walk and no driving to the trail start. (We only did the 10K)

Columbia, MD is a master-planned community developed by James Rouse, beginning in 1967. When we lived in Columbia, there were 4 villages, now there are 10. A hallmark of Columbia is the amount of open space for public use. There are 80 miles of paved pathways that link neighborhoods with their village centers and villages to each other.

Our third walk (Easter Sunday) was the Baltimore Walking Club's 10K, Baltimore Inner Harbor (YR 1453). It takes you through the Otterbein Community, the renovated Inner Harbor area, and by the Baltimore National Aquarium, Civil War Ship Constellation, US Coast Guard Cutter Taney #37, the Fells Point area, Canton & Little Italy and much more. The city was alive with energy and packed with families and tourists. When I worked at University Maryland Hospital in inner city Baltimore in the early 70's, it was a <u>much</u> different place.

Our last walk (Monday, before heading home) was the Columbia Volksmarch Club's 10K, Ellicott City – Centennial Lake Walk (YR 1757). This beautiful walk included village sidewalks of Wilde Lake Village, pathways through woods and neighborhoods, next to Wilde Lake and all the way around Centennial Lake. The pathways appear to be utilized fully by area residents. It seems that all of Columbia is keeping fit! The Walk Box is at the Long Gate Sunoco and it is a short drive to Centennial Park to begin the walk.

The Columbia Volkssmarch Club sponsors 6 different walks, so we have good reasons to go back! Another Baltimore walk includes less of the Inner Harbor, but also takes you by Oriole Park at Camden Yards. Of course, meals including crab are a must when in Maryland. We ate at Phillip's famous seafood restaurant at the Inner Harbor and watched Butler beat Michigan State while eating crab cakes at Cacao Lane Restaurant & Bar in Ellicott City.

- Regularly participate in IVV events; include something like special events or an IWV Olympiad.
- Participate in IVV events aimed at attracting new participants.
- Give potential participants rides to their first IVV events.
- Take your spouse, (grand)children and friends on their first IVV walks.
- Aid someone at an IW event by, e.g., Answering their questions about volkssports, Helping solve
 their problems while on the route.
- Take only one brochure per IVV event that you reconsidering attending.
- At IVV events, call attention to safety hazards and problems, e.g., when: Route marking and directions are confusing., Slippery and icy conditions develop,
 A restroom is out of toilet paper.
- Offer to help when you attend IVV events.
- Offer constructive criticism to IVV event sponsors to help them improve subsequent events; e.g., Suggest ways to clarify trail markings/directions.
- Join an AVA member club.
- Become an AVA Volkssport Associate member.
- Form a new AVA member club with neighboring volkssporters, especially if there is none in your immediate area.
- Speak about volkssports to other groups.
- Make a tax-deductible donation to an AVA 'member club, state association, or national organization.
- Raise YOUR awareness of volkssport issues and challenges, and comment to local, state, regional, and national volkssport officials.

- Say hello to those you encounter at IVV events; participants as well as volunteers.
- Be a companion to newcomers.
- Encourage first time participants to buy a New Walker's Pack.
- Thank volunteers for donating their time.
- Compliment event sponsors.
- Congratulate volkssporters recognized for service to volkssporting.
- Express your gratitude to A V A officials when they do good jobs.
- Pass your skills and knowledge along to help others; e.g., Teach a workshop, Lead a seminar, Conduct training, Give a presentation.
- Pay postage when mailing back year-round registrations (or include that amount in your check when only postage-paid envelopes are provided).
- Arrange for your company to make a donation to a local member club or the AVA.
- Share your experiences with others.
- Read a book about walking.
- Learn something new to apply to Volkssports.
- Write about volkssports for, e.g., The American Wanderer, A club newsletter, Local media.
- Take pictures to show others what volkssports are like; for websites, to include with articles to the media; to submit to the AVA and The American W a n derer.
- Post event information and brochures on bulletin boards at work, in community libraries and recreation centers, etc.
