### 2013 Incentive Book Explanation:

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#### Volkssporters Walk The Canadian Rockies

Traveling to Great Falls, Montana was the first challenge for four members of the Volkssport Club at West Point. Nancy and Farrell Patrick of Fort Montgomery and Doris Rogers and Dorothy Basini both of New Windsor, gathered with walkers from 19 states for a twelve day walking trip with Tater Tours. Introducing ourselves at the "meet and greet" we learned our oldest walker was



87 and finishing her goal of walking all 50 states for the second time. The youngest walker was 23, a recent college graduate, who was joining his mother as a first time volkswalker. A mother-daughter team joined us and the Patrick's were the only mother-daughter-daughter-daughter-daughter.

We traveled to Helena, Montana for our first walk. Along the city trail we saw the original governor's mansion, the state capitol and Last Chance Gulch, a restored miner's village, where gold was discovered in 1864. Most of the afternoon was spent at the Charles M. Russell Museum which houses more of Russell's work than any other museum in the world. Russell is one of America's best known western artists who was a cowboy, advocate of the Northern Plains Indians, environmentalist and conservationist. This was truly one of the highlights of our tour.

Crossing the border into Canada took us to the historic city of Medicine Hat. The downtown area still has gas lit street lamps. In the 1880's natural gas and local clays were so abundant that "Gas City" became one of the earliest brick manufacturing centers in Western Canada. On the outskirts of town is the world's largest teepee. Rising many feet high this is not a structure used for housing, it is a symbol of Indians and showcases paintings of tribal life. Continuing on into Alberta we enjoyed the beautiful city of Calgary. Nowhere did we see more beautiful flowers than in this city. Wherever we walked there were pocket parks, pedestrian walkways and baskets of brilliant flowers. Our trail took us along the Bow River where a music festival was providing entertainment in many areas of a lovely park.

We walked through the area where Olympic medals were presented, posed with a city policeman wearing a cowboy style hat, visited a multi-million dollar garden in a mall and lunched in Chinatown. This is a city worthy of another visit!

Our next day of walking was in Johnson's Canyon, a mostly paved trail took us along rapids and finally to a beautiful waterfall. Ground squirrels, native to this area, entertained walkers and provided lots of photo opportunities. As our bus was leaving the area a large black bear ambled across the road and just a short distance ahead traffic was at a standstill for a herd of bighorn sheep standing in the road. In Banff we followed a river path to the Banff Springs Hotel. This was an alternate trail and resulted in climbing over a hundred steps up and up! Banff Springs Hotel is one of the magnificent historic hotels now part of the Fairmount group. A display of old correspondence showed letters of credit for \$50,000 which the wealthy brought for 3—4 month stays in the 1920's. At Lake Louise we enjoyed an entire day of sightseeing and walking at leisure. A trail took us along Lake Moraine to the end where glacier waterfalls come into the Lake.

Highlight #2 was driving along the Icefields Parkway heading to Jasper, Alberta. The Canadian Rockies are breathtaking. We boarded a special bus that transported us to another bus with gigantic tires that could get us to the glacier icefield. Where we were walking the ice is 1,000 feet thick. The glacier is always melting and one could fill a water bottle with pure glacier water.

We continued on to the city of Jasper for a historic city walk. In the afternoon those not fearful of heights boarded a tramway for a seven minute ride up 7500 feet on the mountain. Although that is above the tree line it was interesting to see tiny pockets of vegetation tucked into the rocks. Another dirt trail went up to 10,000 feet for hardier walkers.

Departing the Canadian Rockies we headed into British Columbia for a walk in the city of Kamloops. Miles of trees replaced the beautiful snow topped Rockies. This is the area of cherries and blueberries which we bought at a roadside stand. Kamloops is a sister city of a city in Japan and has a lovely Japanese garden and a Rotary rose garden. We were introduced to "Italian Sodas" at the end of the trail. Vancouver was our last walk in Canada. This was a city we had enjoyed some years ago as our cruise ship returned from Alaska. The waterfront area is a bustling area where travelers board and depart cruise ships. A member of the local walking club acted as guide giving us an interesting perspective on her adopted city.

Alas, our trip was coming to an end with our final walk in Seattle. Olympic Sculpture Park, Space Needle and Pike Place Market where fish throwing is a tourist favorite, all contribute to a city worth visiting. Our group of 48 enthusiastic volkswalkers traveled far, recorded many kilometers, made new friends, renewed friendships and enjoyed the AVA mantra of "Fun, Fitness and Friendship".
