#### 1. WELCOME

The Volkssport Club at West Point and Connecticut Valley Volkssport Club invite you to come enjoy three beautiful Volkswalks adjacent to the Hudson River in New York and the Housatonic River in Connecticut. Gather with old Volkssporting buddies and meet new ones at a special Meet and Greet on Friday evening at the Germania of Poughkeepsie's annual Oktoberfest and at an authentic Italian restaurant, Longobardi's, on Saturday evening. Plan to do other Volkswalks in the area, and enjoy the many historic and cultural sites both in the Poughkeepsie, NY area and in Kent, CT.

**Northeast Regional Events**: This event is **our third year** of clubs in AVA's Northeast Region sponsoring a multi-event weekend to provide more walking/socializing opportunities for the region and to increase participation in our individual clubs' walks. (The Niagara Frontier Volkssport Club hosted the first event in Buffalo and Niagara Falls, NY on Sept. 17-18, 2022 and Walk 'n Mass Volkssport Club followed with their Cape Cod weekend in Hyannis and Provincetown, MA on May 19-21, 2023.) We look forward to a fourth regional walking weekend in 2025.


**For those new to our sport, a special welcome**: We old-timers greatly enjoy the unique opportunity our Volkssporting organization, both regional and national, offers for long-time friendships and for exploring new cities and states with the helpful knowledge and guide skills of local members. So we hope you'll join us at our "Hud to Hou" walking weekend.

**Socializing**: Building and enjoying relationships with other attendees is an important objective of our weekend. In addition to spending time with old friends, we hope everyone will reach out to those who may be new to our organization or who don't know many people from other clubs. We want to ensure that people are not walking alone (unless that's their preference) or feeling left out of circles of reunited buddies. The stick-on name badges provided for the Friday Meet and Greet and Saturday Dinner should be good conversation starters. **REMINDER**: If you have your own **name tags**, remember to bring them. And, don't forget to pack your **water** bottle and your preferred walk **snacks** to enjoy along the way.

**Event Information:** Our walking weekend offers an opportunity to explore three river towns. Poughkeepsie, on the eastern side of the magnificent Walkway Across the Hudson, was New York's second capital in the 18<sup>th</sup> century and is home to Vassar College. Hyde Park (15 minutes north of Poughkeepsie) provides a fascinating perspective on the impact of our 32<sup>nd</sup> U.S. President, FDR. And, an hour to the east, lies the quaint and scenic Housatonic River town of Kent, which has attracted renowned figures from the worlds of diplomacy, film and fashion. And, of course, Native Americans have walked all these lands for over ten thousand years.

#### 3. HOST HOTEL

#### HAMPTON INN AND SUITES POUGHKEEPSIE

2361 South Rd. (US Rt. 9) Poughkeepsie, NY 12601

The hotel's website describes itself as "a comfy Poughkeepsie base in the Hudson Valley." It is located on US Rt. 9, "a 15-minute drive from the Walkway Over the Hudson State Historic Park and The Culinary Institute of America, 2 miles from the Poughkeepsie Galleria Mall, and provides daily free hot breakfast, free WiFi, free parking, and an indoor pool and fitness center."

The **discounted nightly rate** for our event is **\$159** for Friday and Saturday nights (an excellent bargain for the popular fall time in the scenic Hudson Valley). Provide our discount code **WWG** ("<u>W</u>eekend <u>W</u>alking <u>G</u>roup") if you reserve by phone, or enter the WWG code if you reserve online: <a href="https://hilton.com/en/attend-my-event/september2024weekendwalkinggroup/">https://hilton.com/en/attend-my-event/september2024weekendwalkinggroup/</a>. Cancellations must be made before midnight 72 hours before your check-in day – check your hotel confirmation.

If you plan to spend **additional nights** before or after the event, you can make a <u>separate</u> reservation at the same discounted rate of \$159 by calling the hotel again (845-463-7500), listening to the menu options <u>without</u> selecting one, and letting your call roll to the Poughkeepsie Front Desk (i.e., versus going to one of their Call Centers). When the Front Desk clerk answers, ask to be transferred to ext. 2, and Anita or Eileen will make your reservation for the days outside our "WWG block," but at the same \$159 rate.

## DRIVING TO THE HAMPTON INN AND SUITES POUGHKEEPSIE

The hotel is located on US Rt. 9, approximately 4.5 mi. south of the junction of US Rt. 9 and US Rt. 44/NY Rt. 55 (East-West Arterial).

Most attendees will find that the fastest route from the east is via I-84 and from the north/south via I-87.



Our Meet and Greet gathering and dinner will take place on the first day of **Germania of Poughkeepsie's annual Oktoberfest** weekend: Friday, Sept. 6. The organization, which preserves and educates the public about German and German-American culture, was founded in 1860 as a German singing group in Poughkeepsie and settled in the current building in 2006. It also has formed a Volkssport club of the same name.

We are pleased the organization, also an AVA club, has welcomed our Regional Event participants with a special area to meet with our fellow Volkssporters, while enjoying the food, traditional music and dance entertainment, and vendors at their Oktoberfest this year.

Admission to the Oktoberfest is \$5 per person. A la carte food can be purchased, with prices for a meal ranging from under \$10 to over \$20, depending on your selections. Menu last year included traditional Bavarian sausages, pork and chicken dishes, sauerkraut, potato salad, sandwiches, pretzels, apple strudel, cake, and coffee/tea/soda/bottled water. Wine and beer are also available.



## FROM <u>Hampton Inn to Germania</u> (15-20 min.)

- 1. Leave Hampton Inn parking lot, turn right on US Rt. 9S.
- 2. In 0.3 mi. at light, turn left and make a U-turn to US Rt. 9N.
- 3. In 0.4 mi., bear right taking ramp to Spackenkill Rd./NY Rt. 113.
- 4. In 0.5 mi. at light, turn left on Wilbur Blvd. to end.
- 5. At end of Wilbur Blvd (2 mi.), turn left at light on Hooker Ave.
- 6. In 0.1 mi. at light, turn right on South Grand Ave.
- 7. In 0.7 mi. at light, turn right on Baker St. (Arterial East).
- 8. In 0.5 mi., bear left onto US Rt. 44 at US Rt. 44/NY Rt. 55 split.
- 9. In 1.3 mi. at light, turn right on Dutchess 43 (at Purple Car Wash) to Degarmo Rd., but street sign is not visible until after you turn right.
- 10. In 0.2 mi., turn right into Germania of Poughkeepsie facility at 37 Old Degarmo Rd.



#### **6. REGISTRATION PROCEDURES**

#### INDIVIDUAL WALK REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Each participant must:

- Pre-register by filling out the WALK REGISTRATION FORM on the next page, which includes signing the insurance liability waiver. (Do NOT register via OSB.)
- Pay \$4.00 participant fee to do each walk, with or without receiving IVV Credit. AVA's policy (effective Jan. 1, 2024) requires clubs to submit fees for ALL walkers, including "Guests" (formerly referred to as "Free").

Pre-register for the walks by August 1, 2024. Benefits of pre-registration requirement:

- no registration tables at walk Start Points (no money can change hands at the parks)
- less time spent at event with tasks such as paying, signing waivers, getting walk directions
- more accurate estimates of event attendance
- reduction in event expenses by defraying printing charges for onsite registration packets
- reduction of volunteer staff needed for our Event Hospitality Room

**Walk directions/maps** will be emailed to registered participants in August. Be sure to <u>print these</u> <u>documents and bring them</u> with you to the event. **Registration Packets** with name badges, dinner tickets, local attractions, maps, and other information will be provided at the event.

#### **EVENT HOSPITALITY ROOM**

Our **Event Hospitality Room** (the "**Liberty Room**" of the Hampton Inn, 2361 South Rd., Poughkeepsie) will be open as follows:

Sat., Sept. 7: 7 am − 10 am + Sun., Sept. 8: 7 am - 9 am

Pre-registered participants can pick up their information packets. "Drop-ins" who have not previously registered for the weekend should check in here. Volunteer staff will be available to answer questions. NOTE: For walkers who have not pre-registered, a small supply of walk directions will be available at the Start Point of each of the three event walks, while walk participant fees should be paid in the Hospitality Room during hours noted above.

**Event and Distance Books** will be available in the Liberty Room during Hospitality Room hours. Those who have previously purchased books are reminded to bring them. Our three **customized event stamps** for the weekend walks will commemorate the Hudson to Housatonic Regional Event in your record books. Your <u>Record Books will be stamped</u> during open hours of the Hospitality Room. For the Kent walk on Sunday, a stamp will be available at the Start Point.

#### SANCTION AND IVV CREDIT

The walk events have been sanctioned by the American Volkssport Association (AVA) and the International Federation of Popular Sports (IVV) and are conducted under the rules of those governing organizations. Participants will be eligible to earn IVV credit for event and distance.


